Dalhousie Art Gallery presents As We Rise: Photography from the Black Atlantic, an international touring exhibition celebrating community, identity and power.

HALIFAX, NS – January 2023 – This February, Dalhousie Art Gallery will host As We Rise: Photography from the Black Atlantic. Organized by Aperture (New York) and curated by Elliott Ramsey of the Polygon Gallery (North Vancouver), the exhibition features a selection of photographs from the Wedge Collection of Dr. Kenneth Montague. The exhibition will be on display at Dalhousie Art Gallery from February 3rd to April 7th, 2024. The opening reception celebration will take place on Friday, February 2, from 7:00 – 10:00 pm. Curator Elliott Ramsey and Wedge founding Director Dr. Kenneth Montague will be in attendance.

The essence of community lies at the core of this exhibition. Dr. Kenneth Montague founded the Wedge Collection in 1997, Canada's largest privately owned collection dedicated to championing Black artists. The exhibition draws its name from a mantra often invoked by Dr. Montague's father: "Lifting as we rise." This phrase underscores the significance of translating personal success into communal well-being, advocating for reinvestment in the Black community.

This ethos of "lifting as we rise" expands the idea of family beyond close relatives. The exhibition seamlessly blends the familial with the familiar, as each photograph features Black subjects captured by Black photographers. Their authentic portrayal reflects a mutual and consensual gaze, creating a natural connection with the viewer.

The resulting imagery is diverse and heterogeneous, much like a family album. *As We Rise* explores the intersection of community, identity, and power, showcasing the nuanced strength, beauty, and vulnerability of Black life in each photograph.

As We Rise* catalogues and LPs will be available for purchase through Dalhousie Art Gallery and the King's Co-op Bookstore (6350 Coburg Rd, Halifax, NS B3H 2A1) throughout the exhibition run.
